Gospel of Mark All Things New

GOAL: As we continue to walk through Mark, we see this week how Jesus makes all things new.

GET GOING:

1. Mark 3 has five different stories in it. Which one jumps out to you, and why?

2. Pastor Ron shared how Jesus makes all things new. Has Jesus ever made things new in your life, or in the life of someone close to you? What was that like?

3. The first half of Mark's gospel account seeks to answer the question, "who is this Jesus?" What answers do you find to this question in Chapter 3?

BONUS THOUGHT:

An "apostle" is one who is sent out. The reason we are here today and know the saving message of Jesus is because apostles were faithful to the task Jesus gave them.

KEEP GROWING

4. Throughout Mark, Jesus shows that He has power over disease (Mark 1:40-45), nature (Mark 4:35-39), demons (Mark 5:1-13), and even death (Mark 5:35-43). Review each of these passages.

- How do these passages show that Jesus makes all things new?

- What stands out to you in these passages? Which area that Jesus has power over (disease, nature, etc.) is the most significant to you? Why?

- As Jesus has power over all of these domains, how can you use these passages, and ones like these, to share who Jesus is with someone?

5. Jesus shows us that our duty is to do the will of God. What does that look like in your life? What can you practically do this week to do God's will?

BONUS CHALLENGE:

Read Mark 4

Take some time this week to read Mark 4 in preparation for next week's message. As you read, continue to look for ways that Mark shows how Jesus is the Son of God.
