**GOAL:** To gain a biblical understanding of physical healing in the church today.

### GET GOING:

1. Do you think physical healing happens in the church today? Have you ever experienced healing yourself, or do you know someone who was healed in a way that could only be attributed to God?
2. Physical healing in the New Testament is a symbol for what other kind of healing? Why do you think this is important?
3. In your own words, what's the difference between healing on demand and the gift of healing?
4. One of the principles we learned this weekend is to filter everything, whether it's the gift of healing or something else, through God's Word. In what area of your life do you need have a more biblical mindset?

### KEEP GROWING:

5. Are you in need of physical or spiritual healing? Just as God used these situations in the New Testament to spread the gospel and bring Him glory, how do you think God might use your situation to advance His Kingdom?
6. What would you say to someone who prayed for physical healing in this life, and it didn't come, or hasn't come yet? How do you communicate God's love in this type of situation?



**7.** This weekend we learned how to have a biblical approach to understanding spiritual gifts in the church. Review these. What role do spiritual gifts play in your life? Do you need to grow in any of these areas?

- Acknowledge them
- Pursue them
- Exercise them in an orderly fashion
- Subject them to the Word

**Bonus Challenge:** Who in your life could use either physical healing, spiritual healing, or both? Pray for this person this week and be sensitive to the Spirit's leading.

**Memory Verse:** *"There he found a man named Aeneas, bedridden for eight years, who was paralyzed. And Peter said to him, 'Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you; rise and make your bed.' And immediately he rose" (Acts 9:33-34).*
