What I Learned

- This weekend, we learned about how we can listen to God. In Genesis 13,
 Abraham, and his nephew, Lot, found themselves at a crossroads when they
 needed to separate and choose land for their growing families and
 possessions.
- While Lot chose the land that looked good, Abram listened to God and went where God led him.
- We know that we can listen to God through prayer, reading the Bible, and listening to wisdom from other people.

Get Talking

- As we listen to God, we know who He is, believe who He calls us to be, and follow where He leads us.
- This week, take 1 day to ask these 2 questions and spend 3 minutes talking about them:
 - Who are people you listen to, and why do you listen to them?
 - Since God is trustworthy, what are ways you can listen to and follow Him?

Go Deeper

Read: Genesis 13. The Bible reminds us that the more time we spend with God, the better we can know His voice. When everything around us feels noisy, we can always remember that we can listen to God.

- Sometimes, our lives can feel crowded and seem overwhelming with all the noise coming at us. What can you remember about God when you feel that way?
- The more Abram got to know God by listening to and following Him, the more Abram trusted God. How can you get to know new people and become friends with them?

Now What?

Talk with God. God made us to have relationship with Him where we trust Him and listen to Him. We pray by talking and listening to God. Take time now to listen and talk with God.

• God, thank You for giving us the Bible, which is Your true message to us about Yourself. Thank You that we can listen to what You say in the Bible, what You say to us in prayer, and what You say to us through the wise words of other people who know and follow You. In our very noisy world, help us listen to and follow You. Amen.
