What I Learned

- Today we heard the Bible story from Mark 11:1-10 when Jesus rode into Jerusalem and people celebrated Him as a King by laying down robes and waving palm branches.
- Palm Sunday is the day that Jesus rode into Jerusalem the week He knew He would die on a cross.
- We learned that in celebrating who Jesus is and why He came, we can point others to Him.

Get Talking

- When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, the people celebrated. They believed Jesus was the Savior God promised to send, and He was.
- This week, take 1 day to ask these 2 questions and spend 3 minutes talking about them:
- The people in Jerusalem celebrated when Jesus arrived. How can we respond to God's love that He showed by sending Jesus?
- What can help you celebrate and share the truth about Jesus?

Go Deeper

Read: Mark 11:1-19. The Bible tells us that we are set apart, and we show that when we celebrate the truth about Jesus.

- What is something you learned today?
- Jesus is our Savior. This means that He came to rescue us from sin, saving us from the punishment our sin deserves and making the way for us to have a relationship with God. How can we celebrate this truth every day?

Now What?

Talk with God. When we respond to the truth of God's Word by believing in Jesus and living our lives for Him, God says we are set apart. That means we are part of God's family and can celebrate who God is and who He made us to be. Take time to pray and thank Him for saving us.

• God, thank You for sending Your perfect Son, Jesus, to take the punishment for imperfect people, including us. You are so good, and we can never thank You enough! Thank You for setting us apart to know You and believe Your gift of salvation. Help us to celebrate truth and celebrate You by following You and living our lives for You. Amen.
